## **The Starfish Story**

The man knew the starfish would die if left on the beach's dry sand but he reasoned that he could not possibly help them all, so he chose to do nothing and continued walking.

Soon afterward, the man came upon a small child on the beach who was frantically throwing one starfish after another back into the sea. The old man stopped and asked the child, "What are you doing?"

"I'm saving the starfish." the child replied.  
"Why waste your time?... There are so many, you can't save them all so what does it matter?" argued the man.

Without hesitation, the child picked up another starfish and tossed the starfish back into the water...

"It matters to this one."

**Having just completed our fortieth year of continuous service with celebrations and renewed commitment to the communities we serve, this Annual Report provides us a time to reflect upon the progress of our past and to make plans for the challenges that we face going forward. There are times these days when we feel like we are blowing in the winds of change, so the concreteness of this report grounds us in the substance of the work we do so well.**

Throughout this past year 3,206 people turned to VCS for one to one services - at times of personal crisis and suffering or perhaps when a family member was troubled.

Who are the people who turn to VCS in their time of need? Of course I cannot tell you their names but I can tell you that they are your co-workers, perhaps a friend or a relative or someone you know who lives in one of our close-knit communities throughout the Hudson Valley. They are grandparents and other relatives who are raising a next generation of children they did not expect to be caring for, troubled young people who feel threatened in school or in their neighborhood, battered women in need of the long-lasting support of a volunteer counselor.

All types of people come to VCS: moms and dads from all walks of life, from all parts of the community who are struggling under the responsibilities of raising a family; independent elders who are suddenly afraid that they will not be able to care for themselves; veterans who are returning home after their military service. They are some of our most vulnerable citizens and some of our most prominent. They are people who are victims or perpetrators, working or unemployed, living in your neighborhood or in a homeless shelter.

When people come to VCS they are guaranteed compassionate and affordable care that makes a significant and lasting difference in their lives.

The VCS mission is carried out with a sense of pride and purpose by the VCS volunteer work force and professional staff. The Board of Directors ensures that people in our community are provided with the very best counseling and family services and cutting-edge training and workshops focused on social justice and equality for all - with no exceptions.

The report that follows is a snap-shot of our work and accomplishments in 2010. The greatest measure of our success lays in the number of individuals, young people and families who look to us for help and whose lives are changed because we care.

We depend on your continued partnership and financial support to maintain our cautious optimism in order to care for the needs in our communities.

## Services and Programs

VCS Inc. is a unique non-profit family and community service agency located in Rockland County New York. Since 1970, VCS has been a leader in developing innovative programs and delivering services with a pioneering combination of expert professional staff and specially trained, caring, and committed volunteers. During 2010, the agency provided a wide range of services to individuals, families, youth and community groups, including counseling, mentoring, information, referral and advocacy, and nationally renowned training and awareness programs in the areas of domestic violence prevention and social justice.

VCS is dedicated to identifying the gaps in existing social services networks and responding with accessible and cost-effective programs to help people in need. The agency also focuses on raising awareness - both locally and on a national level - of social injustices and on developing programs to address those issues. As a result, new, targeted programs are continually being developed as needs are recognized.

Some of the populations served by VCS programs and services include families in crisis; young people; court-ordered men who batter their intimate partners; the elderly and their caregivers; lesbian, gay, bi-sexual, transgender and questioning individuals and their families and allies; immigrants; cancer survivors; relatives who are caring for the next generation; parents of children with special educational needs; people with developmental disabilities, students who need additional assistance with their school work. Professional populations that are served by and collaborate on agency programs include schools and school administrators; other social service agencies; public-policy makers; the courts and the justice system, local, state and national organizations; elected officials; businesses; and institutions. Agency funding comes from government grants, donations, fundraising and service fees.

All of the various VCS community services and programs are provided in Rockland County with selected programs offered in other locations including: Sullivan County, Orange County, Westchester County, and four boroughs in the City of New York.

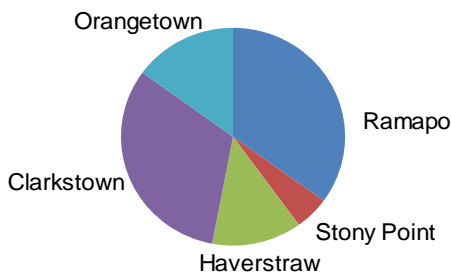

In 1970, VCS began its service to the community by providing a two-pronged approach to changing lives: recruit, train and supervise volunteers who in turn, provide counseling services to court-referred clients. Since that time, Counseling and Family Services has been the cornerstone of the agency, pioneering the innovative use of professionally trained and supervised lay people to provide counseling for many other people who suffer from a wide range of serious social problems. The objective of the Counseling and Family Services programs is to increase the availability of accessible and affordable counseling services for the entire community.

## 2010 Counseling and Family Services Highlights

In 2010 the VCS Counseling and Family Services Department trained and supervised 101 volunteers, including student interns who were fulfilling their course requirements towards their undergraduate or graduate degrees in fields related to counseling and social work. All of these volunteers and students provided counseling and family services to 1,573 people including 368 children and youth. Of the 1,573 people we served, there were 539 clients in the general counseling program and 96 people in divorce services, 90 people in the parent education program, 66 people in the Outreach for Elders program, 351 people in the Relatives as Parents Program/Kinship Care Program. We also trained 34 new volunteer counselors and provided 12 student internships.

In 2010 the Student Advocate responded to 252 requests for information, referrals and school advocacy. The program continues to exceed the funded caseload of 40 cases even though there has been limited outreach and no increase in funding. Parents find their way to this amazing resource and rate the program as very highly successful on their parent satisfaction surveys.

VCS continued to administer the Surrogate Decision Making Committee for the New York State Commission of Quality Care up until November. Along with Rockland County, the VCS catchment areas included Westchester, Orange Sullivan, Bronx, Manhattan and Richmond counties. VCS continues to process the highest caseload in the state for mentally disabled clients in need of invasive medical and dental treatment but who lack involved family to provide consent.

In 2010, 143 cases were processed.

## 2010 Counseling and Family Services Highlights (continued)

In addition to the usual and on-going program responsibilities, some of the more notable Counseling and Family Services program highlights include:

We witnessed a significant staffing change when, after 17 years, Pat Hayes, LCSW retired from her position as Assistant Clinical Director to go off to Florida to be near her children and grandchildren. Betsy Benjamin, LCSW was promoted to Pat's position and we welcomed Rosanne Composto, LMHC who in addition to a wide range of clinical experience, is a faculty member at Long Island University and had completed her clinical internship program at VCS for her masters degree.

The United Way of Rockland County awarded VCS a three year community impact grant along with our collaborator the Haitian American Cultural and Social Organization to continue our pioneering work to provide culturally relevant mental health services. With the enormous influx of Haitian immigrants who fled from the ravages of the earth quake in Haiti in January of 2010, this service became a life-line for many.

The Kinship Care Program continued its highly successful Youth RAPP Group. This group meets four times per year to engage in topics of interest to young people who are being raised by a relative other than their biological parent. Attendance is excellent, confirming the value of the group to the participants.

VCS staff took the leadership in initiating a county-wide anti-hate task force as the result of several bias related incidents occurring in Rockland. The group meets monthly at VCS and has become a chapter of "Not in Our Town" a national group that evolved from the film of the same name which tells how one town in Montana successfully organized to stave off hate groups. The Rockland task force engaged in several community awareness activities and promoted "Not in Out Town" using this flyer —————>



The Rockland Immigration Coalition – co-sponsored by VCS – organized the first annual May Rally for immigrant rights in Spring Valley's Memorial Park after Arizona passed a new round of anti-immigrant laws with racist implications. Over 300 people attended the rally.

The VCS Mini Academy, a Rockland County Youth Bureau sponsored program, held three workshops during 2010: "If Parents are not together: 10 skills for Handling the Challenge"; "Cyberspace Bullying"; and "Undoing Racism". Each of these topics was initiated out of a focus group of young people who were asked to prioritize topics of imminent interest to them. The workshops were well attended.

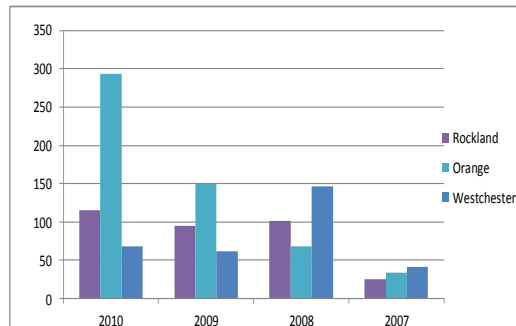
## VCS Community Change Project

The Community Change Project is unique to VCS. The services and programs in the Project focus on providing a critical analysis of the social and political conditions relating to domestic violence, racism, sexism, heterosexism, bias-related incidents and other issues of oppression. Overall, the goal is to develop a coordinated community commitment and response to end all forms of oppression. The sphere of influence reaches into schools, private and public organizations and agencies and businesses in Rockland County, the Hudson Valley and throughout the United States. Programs are offered in three areas central to the VCS mission:

### VCS Domestic Violence Program for Men

VCS administered the New York Model for Batterer Programs Domestic Violence Program for Men in Rockland, Orange and Westchester Counties for the Courts in those counties. A total of 483 men were ordered to the program by the courts in which they were convicted of the crime of domestic violence, a total of 60 in-service trainings were conducted for the staff instructors who facilitated 402 sessions during 2010.

For the 15th consecutive year, the National Training Institute entitled **New York Model for Batterer Programs** was offered twice during the year. Additional presentations were made in Anaheim, CA and in Westchester and Orange Counties in New York.

VCS staff organizes, facilitates or regularly attends a significant number of community efforts towards creating a zero tolerance for domestic violence including the following: the Spring Valley Collaborative; the Criminal Justice Sub-committees and the Men and Boys Sub-committee of the Rockland STOP FEAR Coalition.

VCS expanded its collaboration with the Rockland Family Shelter and the Village of Spring Valley to conduct Court Improvement Training and domestic violence prevention supported by grants from the US Department of Justice. Additionally, VCS took on the responsibility of coordinating the Spring Valley Weed & Seed Program, another program funded by the US Department of Justice.

### **Social Justice Initiatives**

VCS is a significant player in the community to raise awareness in the area of social justice and to promote educational outreach and training to address sexism, institutional racism, heterosexism and homophobia, and other issues of oppression. Some of the highlights in this work during 2010 were:

- Facilitated monthly discussion sessions under the title of “Working Together for Racial Justice”.
- Facilitated the training entitled “Racial Justice Training” for several county government departments.
- Administered and assisted with the 2½ day training “Undoing Racism” with the People’s Institute for Survival & Beyond.

## **VCS Foster Grandparent Program**

VCS completed its first full year of operating the Rockland County Foster Grandparent Program. The program recruits and trains income eligible seniors, 55+, as volunteer Foster Grandparents and matches them with students who are struggling in school. During 2010, seventy-two Foster Grandparents volunteered in eighteen educational programs around the County, working with 1,250 special needs students. The total number of hours of service added up to 61,831!

The program has many collaborative partners including the Rockland County Board of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES), Rockland Community College, Head Start of Rockland, West Street Child Care Center and the following school districts: Clarks-town Central, East Ramapo Central, Nanuet School District, North Rockland Central, Nyack Unified and South Orangetown Central.

The Foster Grandparent Advisory Board, comprising people who have expertise in areas of concern to the program (education, senior issues, data collection and programmatic changes, information on new and retiring volunteers, site updates, etc.) meets every other month during the academic year, September to June. Two active Foster Grandparent Volunteers also serve on the Advisory Board. The Advisory Board conducts an annual program evaluation, an invaluable contribution towards maintaining accountability and transparency.

During 2010, staff organized a theatre party, holiday party, start and end of school year luncheons to which all of the Foster Grandparent Volunteers are invited. The Annual Recognition Dinner, complete with dancing and awards, is attended by the Foster Grandparents, the teachers and principals from the schools where they serve and other friends and elected officials. This is definitely one of the highlights of the entire year!

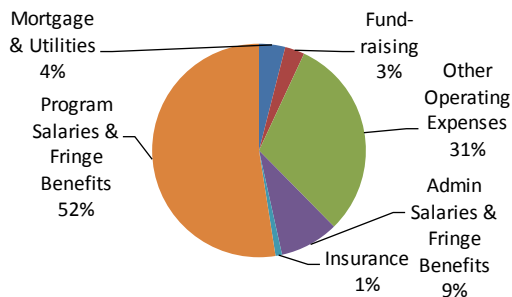
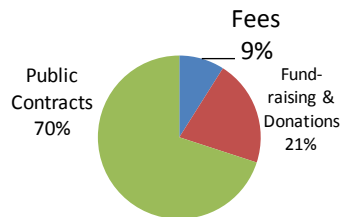
